You may not be familiar with the importance of today, but I am here to tell you that today, May 17, the U.S. Supreme Court unanimously ruled that segregation in public education was unconstitutional, overturning the "separate but equal" doctrine in place since 1896.

The term "segregation" means the act of separating people, historically on the basis of race and/or gender. School segregation began in the year 1896 separating black children from white children. It was felt that the children of former slaves would be "better served" if they attended their own schools and in their own communities. Then opinions began to change, and the Brown v. Board of Education Supreme Court case outlawed segregation in schools in 1954. This era of segregated education went on for some time after, being that many people were enraged with the idea of desegregation.

This turning point in history is something that is highly important and should be talked about, so more people can learn about how the fight for equality in schools affected how we live today.
